"When you have done all you have been commanded, say 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do." The metaphor in the story could seem harsh to us today. A servant has worked hard all day, and rather than receiving a much-needed respite, the mas-

ter commands an additional task. Jesus, however, is appearing to their sensibilities. This was a hierarchical society in which everyone had a place. His listeners would know this. No servant would presume a reward for good deeds. It's important to remember that we do have a place at God's table. But we don't "earn" it. Dining with the Lord at the heavenly wedding feast requires surrender. It requires deep faith in God and His promises. It also requires commitment. The kingdom takes work! There are fields to plow and initiatives to prepare. There are sheep to tend to and family to care for. There are people waiting for our yes to generous service. When we serve dinner at a homeless shelter, we are waiting on the table of Christ. When we visit an ill relative, we're imitating the Good Samaritan. We're visiting Jesus! We're growing his kingdom of life and love. The Gospel today reminds us to check our motives. Are we serving because we're seeking a reward? Or because we have faith that this is who we're meant to serve? That is, is this where we're meant to be? The Gospel reminds us that this faith can do powerful things! "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." But, ultimately, we're not the ones doing the deeds. We're not the ones "earning" the

#### **PASTORS CORNER**

As we celebrate the 27th Sunday in Ordinary *Time*, we also gather to celebrate an annual event in our faith community, our "66th Annual Church Fair". This fair is possible because of the many sacrifices we make, our faithful dedication and the services we provide for each other. On Tuesday,

September 24th, 2019 at the Broussard City Council meeting, I was asked to do the opening prayer. In the prayer I partnered St. Martin de Porres and Dr. King. I was later contacted by Holly, and informed that a reporter wanted me to outline this and asked could she give them my contact information? I responded, "by all means". King and de Porres are similar in these ways; both were men of color, poor, treated unjustly, had great courage, faith filled men of prayer and made tremendous sacrifices for others! Immediately, we realize that both were unselfish and coura-

St. de Porres was born in Lima Peru. Martin was the illegitimate son of a Spanish gentleman and a freed slave from Panama. His father abandoned the family and they grew up in poverty. Throughout his life he was ridiculed but in spite of that he kept going forward until he was admitted into the Dominican Covent of the Rosary in Lima. Dr. King championed equality and he underwent some of the same experiences that Martin de Porres and all of us experienced in our lives.

Mayor Ray Bourque and Councilman Mike Rabon, working with the City Council, decided to merge St. DePorres and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Drive together where they would partner as a street. Meaning they go hand in hand. Then a miracle happened! Someone else joined in with them to help break down more walls of resistance; St. Kathryn Drexel! Now, standing on the backs of these individuals, we have to continue their work to break down these walls. As we celebrate our fair let us remember all three of these amazing individuals stood up for us. Now, we must stand up for and with each other. Break down a wall and build a relationship. As we journey, let us journey towards an Awesome God as He gives us this opportunity. In our opening prayer two or three weeks ago, we prayed, "THE FOUNDATION OF YOUR SACRED LAW IS BUILT ON LOVE OF YOU AND OUR NEIGHBOR!"
